

 Create a Halloween word wall with Spooky Vocab. Talk about favourite pages from the story. Play "Spot the Cat", discussing where the cat is on each page and what it's doing. Role play: Dress up as Halloween characters and recreate a Haunted House. 	 Fine motor: Make matchstick skeletons. Fine motor: Use white string on "gingerbread men" templates to create mummies. Gross motor: dance along to "The Skeleton Dance". Gross motor: dance along to Koo Koo Kanga Roo's "Monster Moves". 	 Discussion: How does Halloween make you feel? Is it scary? Is it real? Is it ok to feel scared? Discussion: What can we do when we feel scared or worried? Make a worry doll? Create a list or mindmap of our favourite things about Halloween. Make your friend a Halloween treat and tell them why you like them.
